Parents are given weekly parent notices informing them what the student will be learning that week. Local assessments are sent home to the parents when completed. Teachers are accessible to the parents should they have any questions. The MAP assessment is discussed with parents in a meeting and parent questions are answered in a timely manner. The district has two interventionists who provide supplemental services in ELA and Math. They also make contact with parents as needed.

The district has hand-outs that are sent home to the parents in a newsletter type format. These include suggestions for helping your child with reading, math, and effective homework skills.Our teachers are available to talk with parents as needed. Our district uses the Remind App which enables parents and teachers to communicate easily by text message or e-mail. The district supplemental ELA and Math teachers send home information to parents as well.

The district administrator has meetings with the staff during the year. Some of the items on the agenda are effective ways to include parents in the child's education. Teachers are encouraged to contact parents when students are doing a good job not just when problems arise. The school implemented the Remind App allowing teachers to send pictures and contact parents easily by e-mail or text message.
